At this wine estate and sculpture park near Aix-en-Provence, you have a choice: stay in five-star luxury or sleep in war-time emergency housing. PAN, Norway

This collection of cabins, two hours' drive from Oslo, is found deep in the ancient forests of Finnskogen and 8m up in the air. The A-frame structures, which sleep four or six people, were designed by Norwegian architect Espen Surnevik; their steeply pitched roofs create intriguing internal nooks and harness maximum light. There is underfloor heating and hot water, and each cabin has a picturesque fireplace as well. The kitchens are pocket perfection; but if you're not self-catering, you can eat at Søstuen 2280, the café and farm shop by the lake. From Nkr5,400, panhytter.no **MS**

CHATAN CABIN, Devon, UK

As if plucked from a Wes Anderson film set, Chatan is a charming two-storey treehouse in a 300-acre rewilding project called Cove Valley in Devon's Exe Valley. The timber-clad cabin, designed by HÅM Interiors, marries ranch-style simplicity with hotel comforts: Ralph Lauren fabrics, weathered antiques and a king-size bed. CABANAS NO RIO, Comporta, Portugal

João Rodrigues – best-known for the Santa Clara 1728 hotel in Lisbon and Herdade No Tempo, his rural vision in Alentejo – began Cabanas No Rio as something modest: an afternoon by the Sado river, two fishermen's huts, his book and a sunset he didn't want to lose. He bought the huts and asked architect Manuel Aires Mateus to intervene as little as possible. The result is precise, restrained, deeply Atlantic. DUNTON HOT SPRINGS, Colorado, US

In a remote valley among the San Juan Mountains of Dolores County, the mining camp turned ghost-town of Dunton Hot Springs is now a deceptively rustic cluster of log cabins. Inside you'll find antique- and art-filled guest suites, an exceptional library and a saloon with an infamous bar. Soaking in the hot springs is essential, as is dining at the communal table. *From \$1,195 plus tax, duntondestinations.com* **JH**

SHU SHU HOUSE, Taiwan

Along a snaking path of mossy stairs above the tourist-thronged alleys of Jiufen, a former mining town about 45 minutes north of Taipei, is the hillside hideaway of Taiwanese florist Alfie Lin. He's filled the two-storey concrete cabin with a wabi-sabi assemblage of objects – Japanese ceramics, oak cabinets from Indonesia and a French copper bathtub – while the windows frame the jungle-cloaked slopes beyond. The name, roughly translated as “counting trees” in Chinese, couldn't feel more fitting. *From \$200 for two people per night, facebook.com/shushuhouse* **CHRIS SCHALKX**



SMOKEWOOD GARZÓN, Uruguay

The beach town of José Ignacio is a magnet for the fashion crowd, but 40 minutes away it's just you and the nighttime stars. This off-grid three-bedroom wooden cabin, with rustic-chic interiors by Uruguayan architect Andrés Gobba Hannay, is a place “to disconnect and to heal”, says co-owner Daniela Ibarra-Howell. Guests can cook local grass-fed meats on the outdoor grill, book horseback riding and fly-fishing trips, or simply curl up with a book on the porch hammock. *From \$1,050 for three nights, smokewoodgarzon.com* **GISELA WILLIAMS**

NUSFJORD ARCTIC RESORT, Lofoten, Norway

Looking out over the mountainous Lofoten archipelago, red and white “rorbuer” – traditional Norwegian fishermen's cabins – sit on stilts above the rocky shoreline of Nusfjord. The village resort offers seafaring and mountain adventures, multiple restaurants, and an art gallery showing work with Fotografiska until October, while the cosy one- and two-bedroom enclaves err nautical in the interiors. *From £225, nusfjord.com* **JOSH HICKEY**



NATIVE, Ireland

In County Cork, outside the coastal village of Ballydehob, Native is a considered sustainable hospitality destination that puts 20 per cent of profits into its local rewilding project. As well as a main guesthouse, four “garden suites” are nestled among trees and grasses. Wood-panelled interiors, sheepskins and earthy ceramics lend a cosy Scandi vibe.
